Choose from the menu below. You can do one or more of the activities, it's your choice. Be ready to share one of them on either December 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> 2023 to your class, and then share all that you have done in the after-school gallery in the hall at 3.30pm on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> December for children, parents and carers. **These are just suggestions...link yours to one of the subject themes and see what you can do. Remember you can research, write, draw, make, bake, create, design, paint, build, collect...anything!**

<p><b>Science</b> Explore your back yard or a nearby park and document the different types of plants and insects you find. Create a mini science journal with drawings and observations.</p>	<p><b>PE</b> Create a sports news report based on a recent event or match of your choosing. The report could be written, performed, filmed or done as an audio file to accompany a video found online.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> With a focus on reading fluency, find a text you would like to practise reading, to fluently and confidently read to the class. You don't need to memorise it.</p>
<p><b>English</b> Go on a nature walk and collect interesting objects like leaves, rocks, or feathers. Use them to write a descriptive paragraph that paints a picture in the reader's mind.</p>	<p><b>Maths</b> Make your own co-ordinate treasure map. Go all out with tea staining and make sure you have an X that marks the spot. Tip – Draw on the co-ordinates first and make sure you measure these so they are evenly spaced. Then you can draw your map.</p>	<p><b>Computing</b> Do some research on Google as a company and present your findings in any way you choose: Powerpoint, poster, video.</p>
<p><b>Art</b> Explore water! Create a piece of art work that captures water. Be creative and make it however you want, use any size piece of paper or any mediums or you could make a sculpture, if you would like!</p>	<p><b>RSHE</b> We have had visits from local police this half term and had sessions on antisocial behaviour and online safety. Can you create something to show what you have learned?</p>	<p><b>RE</b> Find out more about a religious event that is taking place this half term. For example, Diwali, Hanukkah or the meaning behind each of the weeks of advent. You can present your findings however you wish, how about trying a video 'news' report?</p>
<p><b>History / Geography</b> Our first project has been Eyam and the plague. Can you create a survival guide with either the funny suggestions from the past, or more effective methods which could actually help?</p>	<p><b>Wellbeing</b> Try a mindfulness exercise, like deep breathing or yoga, for 10 minutes each day for a week. Write a short reflection on how it made you feel.</p>	<p><b>Languages</b> Design a Christmas market stall and label the items on sale in French (or another language of your choice). You might choose to sell food, toys, jewellery, gifts or even Christmas decorations. You could draw or paint your market stall, or even make a model of it. Be creative and have fun!</p>
<p><b>DT</b> Design a simple paper prototype of a board game. Include rules and instructions for playing. Test it out with your family and make improvements based on their feedback.</p>	<p><b>Music</b> Create Artwork or Model Inspired by a Song. Picture yourself on stage with your favourite popstar/band, singing your beloved song. Capture the song's essence in your artwork or model. Then share your creation and explanation with the class.</p>	<p><b>Own Choice</b> Looking at the themes across your menu, you can have a free choice of anything that you think links with any of these themes. This is particularly useful if you have a BIG idea in your mind!</p>
